


Some suggestions

Hearing God in Poetry by Richard Harries is an ideal Lent book for 2022 for poetry lovers and anyone interested in how some of the world's finest poets have expressed faith in their work. This book of daily readings will introduce you to some wonderful poetry for Lent and Easter.



Hope and the nearness of God. Hope is one of the theological virtues and it is far more profound than mere optimism. Today, pessimism and despair seem all too prevalent.
